

# Sights set on Africa trip

A GROUP of Newark youngsters are trying to raise more than £3,000 each for an educational expedition to Africa.

**Josef Mayfield, 15, Charlie Wardill, 15, Bradleigh Picker, 15, Tom Swan, 14; and Matthew Hempsall, 14,** hope to travel to Tanzania in July, 2012, for a trip organised through the **World Challenge** organisation.

The boys are among 14 pupils from the Carre's Grammar School, Sleaford, set to travel to

the African nation, with the goal of climbing Mount Kilimanjaro.

Newark-based teacher and trip organiser **Mr Martin Wilson** believes the trip will be a life-changing experience.

"What this trip will do is teach them a number of life skills, which will help them grow as individuals," he said.

"The fundraising teaches them money management, and the trip will make them more rounded individuals."

Physics teacher **Mr Steve Lord**, of Newark, will also be accompanying the pupils.

As part of the **World Challenge** the pupils have to help organise the trip themselves, as well as raise the funding.

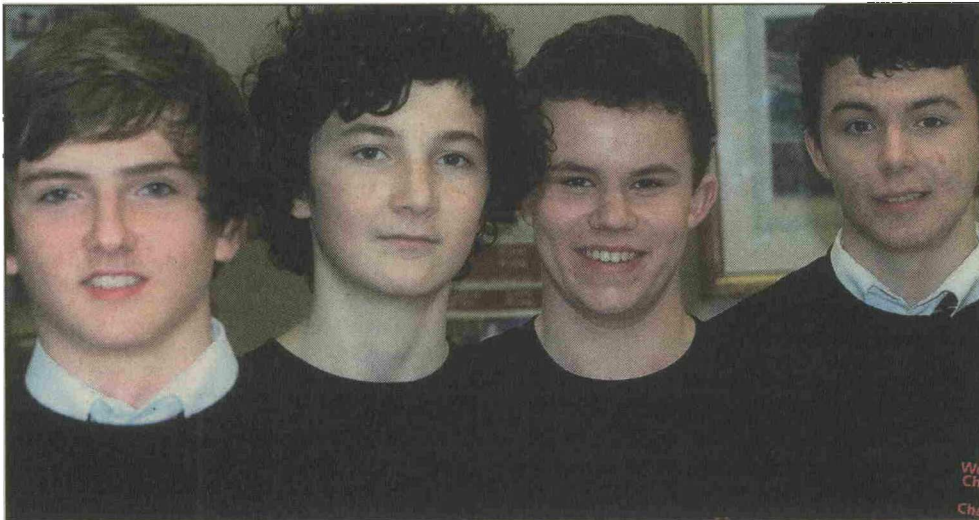
The will also organise the proposed 5,895m climb up the world's fourth largest peak.
