Speaker at Seagate Bridgegate shop on Monday was Paul Tulloch, a Community Education Officer from Saltcoats, who gave an illustrated talk on taking 14 pupils from Largs Academy on a World Challenge Expedition to Namibia.

World Challenge ran 480 expeditions last year, for groups of up to 30 young people, to remote areas of the globe.

The participants spend 18 months fundraising, training and planning for their trip which is designed to take them outside their comfort zones and build team and leadership skills.

Paul was in the Navy, and has been leading expeditions for Services and civilians for 23 years.

The Largs expedition included a few days on safari, a 5 day trek through the Fish River Canyon, and a community project helping a local school, before finishing at the coast where the local sport is sand boarding down 200 metre dunes.

Paul answered questions about the expedition and World Challenge, and a Vote of Thanks was proposed by Allan Morrison.
